Many of our picks feature inclined ladders, which take up less room than straight ladders, but are still easier for kids to climb, says Fenton. There are also stairways, which require more space, but are safer to climb than ladders.

This bunk bed is great for toddlers and younger children who may not be at ease climbing up to the top bunk. This also means that the ladder is on the side, making it more accessible for kids (and less daunting for parents and caregivers reading bedtime stories or changing sheets). The entire set is crafted using sustainably-sourced Baltic birch wood that's Greenguard Gold and TSCA-compliant.

The Crate & Kids Babyletto TipToe is a sleek, modern wooden bunk bed that's versatile enough for boys or girls. The natural and white finish is a great choice and blends well with many decor schemes. Parents are enthralled by the fact that it's finished with a durable varnish. It's the perfect fit for a shared bedroom and can be split into two separate beds when your kids reach their teens.

Only a handful of bunk beds made from metal can be as good as this South Shore option, which features a trundle underneath the twin bed at the bottom to accommodate three guests for sleepovers (if the trundle is removed, the bunks transform into two beds). The ladder is also bent to make it easier for children to climb up and out.

Depending on the shape of your room, and how often you'll use the bunks you may want to opt for a L-shaped layout, similar to the one featured in a bedroom designed by Bailey McCarthy. This layout can help save space by allowing two bunks be closer together. This is useful for rooms with low ceilings or smaller space. It's easier to climb up because there are two ladders rather than one slanted ladder which can be difficult to use for children who are younger.

The height of the bunk bed could be an important factor when deciding if your kids will be at ease sleeping in a high position. It is important to consider the height of your children as well as your ceilings when purchasing a bed.

You may also be influenced by the differences between metal and wood bunk beds, as well as the kind of mattress you choose. Kuo says that wood bunk beds are generally more appealing because they have an elegant, natural look and can withstand frequent use. However "the most important thing is to select a bunk bed that is compliant with the standards of the industry and is secure for your children," she adds.

3. Pottery Barn Kids Belden Full-Over-Full Bunk Bed
