A key to online shopping is planning your list and claiming a delivery time slot before the spots are filled up. Also, you'll need to be able to swap items based on availability.

1. Instacart

The online grocery delivery service allows you to order through an app on your mobile or a website and create a virtual cart that is fulfilled by the personal shopper on specific day. Instacart collaborates with more than 1,400 national regional, local, and retail banners to deliver from 80,000+ stores across North America. There are even membership-only store locations like Costco and Sam's Club, on the platform.

Instacart's fees include the \$2.99 same-day delivery fee and an additional \$3.99 service fee (plus tips for the customer). These prices are similar to the ones you would pay at your local grocery store. However, you don't have to drive, sit in a parking lot, or wait in a line. Instacart offers a year-long membership to customers who purchase at minimum 14 times a year. This will save you money on service and delivery fees

If you're concerned about grocery costs, Hindert suggests price-shopping prior to adding items into your cart. Instacart lets you add nutrition information and specific prices to your list so that you can compare the prices and ingredients of the items in your cart. You can also create a "shoppable list" by using your Instacart application. This is useful for future grocery shopping trips.

Hindert believes that Instacart isn't the most efficient option for grocery shopping as it can lead to impulse purchases. In addition, grocery delivery services don't always offer the same sales in stores that you would discover at your local grocery store.

2. Amazon Grocery

Amazon Grocery lets customers have their groceries delivered directly to their doorstep. The products are delivered from local Amazon warehouses by couriers or at a location that is manned. The service offers both next-day and same-day delivery. Amazon offers a variety of groceries available, including fresh dairy, produce seafood, meat, frozen food, packaged goods and household products.

Amazon Grocery is one of the most well-known grocery shopping services out there and with good reason. Its competitive pricing, large variety of products, and convenience features make it a great option for shoppers looking to save money and time on their grocery shopping. Additionally the service has a significant sustainability aspect and is a great choice for those who are seeking to reduce their carbon footprint.

Its focus on the weekly food shopping trip, the affordable cost and curated choices put it in direct competition with traditional supermarkets Brick Meets Click's Bishop said. "Grocers who aren't a standout in any of these categories are more susceptible to Amazon Grocery," Bishop added.

3. Walmart

Instacart is a renowned online grocery service that connects you with personal shoppers who can shop for you at local stores. It is accessible

in over a thousand cities and is a great option for shoppers who like to shop at chain supermarkets but also want to avail discounts at wholesalers like Costco and Aldi. Instacart provides same-day delivery to numerous markets, and its selection includes stores like Food Lion, Kroger, Wegmans and Shop n Save. It offers bulk items as well, which is great for those who frequently visit the store to stock up on basic items.

Walmart is another major name in the world of e-commerce for groceries. You can order online and choose a time for pickup or delivery, then add your purchases to the virtual shopping cart. The site offers rollback discounts and Rockland 20 Inch Expandable has a good range of products, from produce to pantry essentials and personal items for personal care. Walmart+ is a service that provides groceries from local stores.

Thrive Market is an online grocery store that specializes in organic and non-GMO food items. Membership costs \$5 per month, billed annually. It offers a variety of food items to choose from including meat, fish, and dairy. Thrive offers free shipping on orders of more than \$35, and the selection includes items that are healthy for you and the planet.

4. Smith's

Online grocery shopping can be lifesaver for many busy families. These services can allow you not just take one chore per week off your list, but also to plan your meals and budget for. However there are many differences between online grocery stores are created equal. It's crucial to select the right option, whether you're seeking convenience or a large variety of goods.

Other online grocery stores offer convenient delivery and pickup options. Choose the store's location in your Smith's App Shop online, make your purchase and then select the time of pickup. When you arrive, pull into your parking spot and dial a number to let an associate know you're there. The associate will carry your order out to you in the parking area.

5. Peapod

Peapod is a pioneer in online grocery shopping. It operates in 24 US markets. In certain markets, customers can place orders and get groceries, pantry products fresh produce and meats, dairy, Stant 10231 Radiator Cap organic and natural foods cooked meals, office and school items delivered. Customers can also purchase alcohol and personal care items. Customers also can pick up orders at more than 200 Peapod pickup locations, many of which are located within Ahold USA's brick and mortar stores such as Stop & Shop.

Peapod uses data to track the brands that are popular with shoppers and products, allowing the online grocer to recommend similar products. The system allows shoppers to view every item in their shopping carts at once and to make use of filters to narrow the results. Since grocery shopping is a habit-driven activity the Skokie company in Illinois makes use of data to predict which products the shopper would buy and then push them to the top of the list.

The service is based on its drivers, which are also referred to as brand ambassadors. "Food is inherently emotional," Bienkowski told Food Dive, and being able to interact with the person who brings customers their orders makes the experience more enjoyable and convenient. And, unlike many e-commerce delivery services when customers meet the driver with their groceries, they can be confident that the order is in good hands.

Peapod is an early innovator in online grocery shopping, has invested in technology so that it is able to compete against its rivals. However, it hasn't managed to make as significant an impact as other grocery delivery services such as Instacart and Amazon Fresh. But the 28-year veteran of the battle for online grocery delivery is attempting to boost its competitiveness by expanding its e-commerce offerings. It recently launched a brand new mobile shopping experience based on its proprietary PRISM platform at its own websites, as Well Woven Area Rugs as the sites of its parent company, Ahold Delhaize USA.
