Safety

In a crash, newborns and infants are most at risk. Neck and head injuries are among the most frequent. Travel infant car seats are designed to protect them by restraining them on the most rigid areas of their bodies, the hips and shoulders. They also absorb energy through impact-absorbing materials as well as a protective shell.

Newborn babies should always ride rear-facing in their car seat, and these seats are designed to keep them in this position during both short and long trips. Travel infant car seats must be fitted with a correctly installed five-point harness and the correct installation angle. It is a good idea to also check for any obstructions or airways that may be blocked during an accident. A lot of times, bulky clothing like snowsuits and coats can compress in the event of a crash, making straps loose and increasing the chance of injury.

Load legs are another important safety feature. They work like an anti-rebounding bar, but they are built into the base of the car seat. The load leg supports the car seat against the vehicle floor, which limits movement in the event of a crash, shifting the baby's energy onto the car frame and seat belt anchors.
